GENERAL INFORMATION



- · School starts at 9.00am each morning and finishes at 3.25pm.
- Students must be present in school on time the first bell rings at 8.50am and all students are expected to be onsite and mustering in the Year 7 area.
- If students arrive on site early, they may go to the Canteen for Breakfast Club or meet their friends onsite on the main playground. There is no supervision on site until 8.30am each day.
- Students who regularly arrive late to school (and to lessons during the day) will have those late minutes counted and will have a Lunchtime or an After School Detention
- Break time is at 11.20-11.45am (25 mins);
 Lunch is at 1.45-2.25 pm (40 mins).

UNIFORM IN SEPTEMBER 2024



- You may be aware, the Government have updated their guidance in regard to school uniform and asked schools to ensure that branded items are kept to a minimum to keep the cost of purchasing down for parents and carers. In response to this, we reviewed our school uniform policy last September.
- The key changes were that those students who wear a blouse will now be required to wear a plain white revere blouse, not the blue and white striped one.
- The only branded item of clothing that students must wear in school is the school blazer.
- If students would like to wear a jumper, they must purchase a branded one, but this is not a uniform requirement.
- The school PE kit has also been adapted; we would recommend that you take a photo of the images in the hall so you are clear on the items of kit that are needed.
- All students are required to wear the branded PE polo shirt and rugby shirt. All other items can still be purchased with the Oaklands logo from Skoolkit; alternatively, you can buy these from other retailers.
- Those students who choose to wear sports leggings must purchase the Oaklands branded ones.

UNIFORM CHANGES FOR SEPTEMBER 2023



- Blazers are compulsory and must be worn to and from school.
- · Shirts are white. 1) Collared shirts with a tie or 2) white revere blouse no tie.
- Jumpers are optional.
- Trousers should be navy blue, formal tailored trousers (not Chinos). Skinny fit / super skinny fit trousers are not acceptable.
- · Skirts should be navy blue, with sewn down pleats all around.
- Socks students should wear BLACK ankle socks and or/ tights. Knee high socks are not allowed to be worn.
- Shoes students are required to wear black flat proper shoes; not casual shoes (canvas, leather trainer style).
- Coats for inclement weather, parents may purchase a plain (without logo) appropriate school coat, preferably navy or black to be worn over the blazer.

HOMEWORK



- In Year 7, students at Oaklands will receive a maximum of 2 pieces of homework per evening. Each piece should last no more than 20 minutes.
- As part of transition, to help students manage this new workload, we phase in the homework timetable beginning with core subjects only in the first half term and then adding in others in the second half term up to Christmas.
- Students can access their homework on ClassCharts app, and they will receive a homework timetable. This means parents can always see what has been set.
 Parents and students will receive personal log in details which allows them to filter the homework specific to the student.
- Failure to complete homework will result in Additional Learning Opportunity (ALO) at lunchtime or after school with the subject teacher or if it is a persistent issue, a Head of Department After School Detention will be given.

ATTENDANCE

GOOD ATTENDANCE IS A KEY FACTOR IN ACADEMIC SUCCESS



- We expect all students to attend school every day unless they are genuinely ill. Our school target is 96% attendance.
- It is the responsibility of a parent/carer under the Education Act to ensure that their child attends school regularly.
- Any student whose attendance dips below 90% is categorised under Government criteria as a "Persistent Absentee" and will be closely monitored. Parents will be advised if this happens.
- HOLIDAYS: the school will not authorise a term time absence for the purpose of a holiday, unless there are exceptional circumstances. Holidays in term time are likely to lead to the issuing of a Fixed Penalty Notice.
- <u>A Leave of Absence Form</u> (LOAF) must be submitted in writing to the school before any period of absence. LOAFs can be found on the school website (see Parents tab) or collected from the Attendance window (by Student Services).

ORGANISATION EQUIPMENT AND CLASS CHARTS



Organisation

- · Keep a copy of your child's timetables at home (lesson and homework).
- · Provide a sturdy school bag (ideally rucksack). Please avoid handbag styles.
- Encourage your child to pack the school bag the night before.
- Don't forget PE kits, cooking ingredients, money or forms may also be required on certain days.

ClassCharts / Planner

- Parents should check their child's ClassCharts account. Is homework being recorded and ticked off?
- Parents can email tutor/teachers with any concerns.



FOBS/CANTEEN





- · We use a cashless catering system in the Canteen.
- · Students will have a "fob" which carries their details electronically.
- Parents can use the school's online payment system (Scopay) to top up their child's fob (a link to set this up has been sent to you all). Students can also load cash onto the fob using a machine in the canteen.
- · You can also set daily limits of expenditure. £3 £3.50 is usually sufficient.
- When parents log on to top up the fob, they can see a list of food items that have been previously purchased.
- Students can either bring packed lunches to school or purchase food from our canteen.

LOCKERS







- · A one-off £5.60 payment per student is required to secure a locker.
- The locker will remain theirs until Year 9.
- The students will be given a padlock and a key.
- The cost of a replacement key/padlock (if they lose their key) is £8.20.
- Students are not permitted to buy/bring their own padlock they must be purchased from the school.

CLASSCHARTS





- We run an electronic rewards and behaviour monitoring system at Oaklands.
- Students and parents have an online "account" and can see which teachers have awarded them positive or negative points and why.
- Students are awarded badges as they accumulate positive points and are entered into a half-termly raffle to win gift cards.
- Badges can be worn on the blazer.
- · Points are not carried forward to Year 8.
- · Year 7 students and parents will receive log-on details in September.
