# English

<b>Half Term</b>		
<b>Autumn 2 Weeks 1-4</b>	Revision of 19 <sup>th</sup> Century Novel and Shakespeare's Macbeth. All students will be reminded of the key strategies for success in dealing with a Literature extract and using this a spring-board into analysis. Key quotes to be revised and remembered for specific themes and characters. <b>AT8: Mock Lit Paper 1, 1hr 45 mins, 27<sup>th</sup> –28<sup>th</sup> November</b>	Watch Macbeth on film - we have recommended a variety such as animated tales, Hollywood adaptations (Roman Polanski) and classic BBC versions with Ian McKellen and Judi Dench.
<b>Mocks Weeks 5-6</b>		Use the recommended websites for extra research.
<b>Week 7</b>	Feedback on AT8	Read again the modern text at home over the Christmas holidays (Lord of the Flies or An Inspector Calls or Animal Farm or Pigeon English) and use the revision books prepared by the department to support revision.
<b>Christmas Holiday</b>		
<b>Spring 1 Weeks 8-13</b>	<b>After-school revision classes start for all students - every Wednesday</b> Focus will move to English Language GCSE Paper 1. All students will be taught again the key strategies for success in dealing with an unseen Fiction extract. There will also be a focus on ambitious and successful creative writing under timed conditions. <b>AT9: Mock Lang Paper 1, 1hr 45 mins, 16<sup>th</sup> January</b> Teaching and learning after the mock will focus on Unseen Poetry (compulsory element of LIT GCSE) and some inter-leaving of Power and Conflict poems will also be included. <b>GCSE Language Paper 2: Intensive revision of non-fiction extracts + writing to express opinion and perspective.</b>	Buy the revision guides from the school Finance Office to support independent revision strategies. There is a revision guide for each of the set texts and for the Power and Conflict poems.  Download past papers and practise these at home (as well as completing sample papers/questions set on ClassCharts by your class teacher).
<b>Half Term</b>		Try not to lose the knowledge gained of Macbeth earlier in the year: keep watching online versions to keep the story and the text fresh in your mind.
<b>Spring 2 Weeks 14-19</b>	<b>AT10: English Language Paper 2 Mock, 1hr 45 mins, w/c 17<sup>th</sup> March</b> After feedback we will begin re-reading and revising. <b>Modern Novel and Poetry – POWER AND CONFLICT</b> From this point onwards, the teaching programme will interleave English Language and English Literature skills with frequent in class tests.	Keep re-reading the modern novel and revisit the poems one at a time.
<b>Easter</b>		
<b>Summer 1 Weeks 20-24</b>	Intense rolling revision, rotating Literature texts with Language practice papers to keep all the skills bubbling at their optimum point. Weekly revision classes are even more important now.

<b>Examples of Homework/ Home Learning</b>	Creating quotation grids and learning them for Lit texts. Re-reading key extracts for flipped learning. Essay questions based on language and literature tasks. Prepare presentations on key topics. Annotate key extracts of texts looking for specific writing devices. Answer practice exam questions focusing on particular skills e.g. evaluation or deconstructing authorial choices. Prepare cards for revision of themes and characters. Mind-map writing devices and why you might want to use them.
<b>Assessment Tasks/ method and frequency</b>	Class assessment is an ongoing focus, with staff marking and assessing practice answers at frequent intervals. The use of SIR (Strength, Improvement and Response) marking enhances the effectiveness of this process. There will be two formal examinations in January and March, but there will also be frequent tests in class to improve timed writing: speed and accuracy.
<b>Parents/Carers can help by</b>	Encouraging students to spend time reading the set texts in quiet surroundings. Buy newspapers and encourage a climate of reading non-fiction and discussing topics to establish point of view and ways of expressing this. Encourage students to attend the after school revision classes.
